Update on Police Department Operations

Chief Nylund's last day is Friday, March 5th, 2021. Chief Nylund reports he has received (2) applications for the vacancy that was posted. George Burger, who is currently a Part Time Officer has expressed interest in possibly a Part-Time Interim Police Chief position if the Board so chooses. There are currently 5 Part Time Police Officers. Discussion was had by Board and Public. Some residents are hearing that residents in the community have expressed liking and maintaining a Community Police Department. Some in attendance expressed risk and liability concerns for the Township in running its own

Police Department. Discussion about having a working session with both the City of Tower Counsel and Township of Breitung Board members. Chairman Tomsich has been in contact with St. Louis County Sheriff's Department, and after March 5th, they will respond to emergencies only. This item will be on the agenda for the Annual Meeting.

After some discussion, five options to review in the future were:

- 1. Keep the Department Status Quo as it is now
- 2. Keep St. Louis County Sheriff's Department Emergency Response Only
- 3. Contract with St. Louis County Sheriff's Department for Patrol
- 4. Breitung Township/City of Tower run individual Police Departments
- 5. City of Tower takes over managements of the Police Department with the Township of Breitung contracting with the City of Tower

Police Department Operations:

Tim Tomsich has given St. Louis County a list of days and hours Breitung Township would like to see patrol by St. Louis County for the month of March (instead of emergencies only) filled based on monies remaining in the March 2021 Police Budget. These would be overtime shifts for St. Louis Count Sheriffs to sign up for and the Township would pay \$70/hour. Shifts may be difficult to fill. It was said that having a local police department comes with a lot of risk to the township given the current climate towards law enforcement in general. The Law Enforcement career path isn't what it used to be. It was said that when the City of Tower turned to the Sheriff's Department years ago, there was not the coverage that was hoped for. The Township has received a contract with options for the Township from the Sheriff's Department if this is the choice for a long term solution. The cost of a 1 year contract ranges from \$100,000-\$122,000 for 1 officer at 40 hours a week. Residents voiced their concern about not having a community presence, as there are many community activities and a few local businesses that a local police department should be involved in, and they are normally first to arrive as a first responder in an emergency. It was stated that having a local police department vs. a county cop didn't make some feel safer.

Motion by Tony Sikora that the Town Board enters into a short term Law Enforcement contract with St. Louis County to provide patrol service and for the Board to continue its investigation in to a long term solution for Law Enforcement Services for the community. 2^{nd} by Denis Osterholm

Meanwhile, various other options are to be reviewed for possible revision beginning in January 2023. Motion not seconded; motion failed.

Dear Dianna:

We need your help. Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) among public safety staff, particularly law enforcement, has become a significant challenge for the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust (the Trust) and our members. Stand-alone PTSD claims first became compensable in 2013 and now make up more than 30% of the Trust's overall annual workers' compensation claim costs. The good news is that PTSD and other mental health conditions are **treatable** and often **preventable**.

What you can do

Start by reducing the stigma. If appropriate, have a person in a leadership position share their own struggles and create an environment where it's safe to get help. Make prevention and treatment a top priority. Work with your human resource team and other city leadership to develop and fund prevention, response, and return-to-work strategies.

To assist you in your efforts, we've created an online public safety PTSD and Mental Health Toolkit. In the toolkit you'll find information about prevention, programs, therapies, human resource considerations, and much more. Learn more at www.lmc.org/ptsd.



Subject: Wastewater IRRRB grant

Last week I called Chris Ismil at the IRRRB to discuss the possibility of using the approved \$250,000 grant for financing the water line replacement since that was looking to move forward before the filtration system. He looked into the grant and was surprised that we did not spend any of it yet since it was approved in November, 2019 and the grant application stated that construction would start in six months. He was not happy about it is a pleasant way to describe the conversation we had.

This week he called back after reviewing it with Commissioner Phillips and legal staff and they cancelled the grant. He said to apply after July 1st and approval would more than likely be accomplished at their December, 2021 meeting if construction is going to start in the summer of 2022.

The grant was applied for through the Township on the wastewater's behalf and now our name has been tarnished by this set of events, further, Chris has asked for absolute full documentation on any and all grant applications regarding secured funding, solid estimates or recent bids and firm construction dates. So he said to get all of this ready for the manhole improvement grant application which won't be reviewed for approval until after July 1, 2021.

We can discuss more at our next meeting in March.

I wish I would have been notified of the second meeting which I see all homeowners with the boilers were made aware of but not me. I still would like to see about the height of these units get addressed, smoke and odor is still an issue.

After reading some of the homeowners concerns I noticed that one in particular mentioned he can't afford to have seasoned wood on hand which I believe is a big issue with the smoke and odors these emit.

Another neighbor stated he lives nearby and doesn't have an issue, the closest neighbor to him that has a boiler has a tall stack and doesn't seem to smoke anywhere near as bad as these others from what I noticed. I've also been told by a few others that Jeff Redtske burns dry wood otherwise his unit doesn't function properly.

So if this can be brought up at some point in the future I would appreciate it.

ORDINANCE NO 2016-15

The Board of Supervisors of the Town of Breitung Ordains:

OUTDOOR WOODBURNING FURNACES

The Board of Supervisors of the Township of Breitung ordains:

Purpose

Although outdoor furnaces may provide an economical alternative to conventional heating systems, concerns have been raised regarding the safety and environmental impacts of these heating devices, particularly the production of offensive odors and potential health effects of uncontrolled emissions. This chapter is intended to ensure that outdoor furnaces are utilized in a manner that does not create a nuisance and is not detrimental to the health, safety, quality of life and general welfare of the residents of the Town.

2. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

WOOD — Dry, clean fuel only such as trunks and branches of trees and bushes, cord wood or untreated dimensional lumber, but does not include leaves, needles, vines or brush smaller than one inch in diameter.

OUTDOOR FURNACE — Any equipment, device or apparatus, or any part thereof, which is installed, affixed or situated outdoors for the primary purpose of combustion of fuel to produce heat or energy used as a component of a healing system providing heat for any interior space.

UNTREATED LUMBER — Dry wood which has been milled and dried but which has not been treated or combined with any petroleum product, chemical, preservative, glue, adhesive, stain, paint or other substance.

Permit required.

No person shall cause, allow or maintain the use of an outdoor furnace within the Town of Breitung without first having obtained a permit from the Town Board. Application for permit shall be made to the Town Board on the forms provided for existing outdoor furnaces only. The Town of Breitung will not issue permits for new outdoor furnaces. Use of new outdoor furnaces is prohibited within the Township of Breitung.

4. Existing outdoor furnaces.

Any outdoor furnace in existence on the effective date of this chapter shall be permitted to remain, provided that the owner applies for and receives a permit from the Town Board within one year of such effective date; provided, however, that upon the effective date of this chapter all the provisions hereof shall immediately apply to existing outdoor furnaces. All of the provisions of this chapter shall continue to apply to existing outdoor furnaces which receive permits. If the owner of an existing outdoor furnace does not receive a permit within one year of the effective date of this chapter, the outdoor furnace shall be removed. "Existing" or "in existence" means that the outdoor furnace is in place and in use on the site.

Replacements of existing outdoor furnaces are prohibited within the Township of Breitung and will not receive permits from the Town of Breitung.

5. Specific requirements.

- A. Permitted fuel. Only firewood and untreated lumber are permitted to be burned in any outdoor furnace. Burning of any and all other materials in an outdoor furnace is prohibited.
- B. Months of operation. Outdoor furnaces shall be operated only between October 1 and April 30.
- C. The stack of the unit should, at a minimum, be taller than the roofline of all nearby structures. Stacks that are too short do not allow the emissions to adequately disperse.

6. Suspension of permit.

- A. A permit issued pursuant to this chapter may be suspended as the Town Board may determine to be necessary to protect the public health, safety, quality of life and welfare of the residents of the Town of Breitung if any of the following
- (1) Malodorous air contaminants from the outdoor furnace are detectable outside the property of the person on whose land
- (2) The emissions from the outdoor furnace interfere with the reasonable enjoyment of life or property;
- (3) The emissions from the outdoor furnace cause damage to vegetation or property; or
- (4) The emissions from the outdoor furnace are or may be harmful to human or animal health.
- B. A suspended permit may be reinstated once the condition which resulted in suspension is remedied and reasonable assurances are given that such condition will not recur. Recurrence of a condition which has previously resulted in suspension of a permit shall be considered a violation of this chapter subject to the penalties provided as a misdemeanor 7. Waivers.

Where the Town Board finds that extraordinary and unnecessary hardships may result from strict compliance with this chapter, it may vary the regulations so that substantial justice may be done and the public interest secured, provided that such variations will not have the effect of nullifying the intent and purpose of this chapter or of jeopardizing the health, safety, quality of life or welfare of the public. In varying any regulations, the Board may impose such conditions and requirements as it deems reasonable and prudent. The Board may, at its discretion, hold a public hearing as part of its review. If the Board grants the waiver, a permit shall be issued for the outdoor furnace. If the Board denies the waiver, the outdoor furnace must either be brought into compliance with this chapter or removed. If the Board does not take any action with respect to the waiver within 60 days from its receipt of an application for waiver, the waiver shall be

8. Penalties for offenses.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor as defined by Minnesota State Statute. In addition, any permit issued pursuant to this chapter shall be revoked upon conviction of a second offense and the subject outdoor furnace shall not be eligible for another permit. Each day that a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense. The owners of premises upon which prohibited acts occur shall be jointly and severally liable for violations of this chapter. Any fine imposed hereunder shall constitute a lien upon the real property where the outdoor

9. Effect on other regulations.

Nothing contained herein shall authorize or allow burning which is prohibited by codes, laws, rules or regulations promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, or any other federal, state, county, or local agency. Outdoor furnaces, and any electrical, plumbing or other apparatus or device used in connection with an outdoor furnace, shall be installed, operated and maintained in conformity with the manufacturer's specifications and any and all local, state and federal codes, laws, rules and regulations. In case of a conflict between any provision of this chapter and any applicable federal, state or local ordinances, codes, laws, rules or regulations, the more restrictive or stringent provision or requirement shall prevail.

The Board had received complaints regarding the smoke and smell from the OWB and burning year round. Chairman Tomsich stated many city/towns have banded or limited OWB. Sup Tekautz stated he tried to defend the residents "rights" with OWB. The residents asked if the Board would consider change/modify the ordinance. There had been two complaints and nether resident was at the meeting. The changes requested was extend dates of burning (Paragraph #4) to May 31st every year. (Paragraph #5) to allow present residents to replace or fix their OWB but must follow current EPA standards and manufacturer's standards. Changes will be made to the OWB Ordinance and second reading will be at the 11-25-16 meeting. Permits will be required by current OWB owners, with name, type, year of OWB. The Board of Supervisors of the Township of Breitung ordains:

Purpose

Although outdoor furnaces may provide an economical alternative to conventional heating systems, concerns have been raised regarding the safety and environmental impacts of these heating devices, particularly the production of offensive odors and potential health effects of uncontrolled emissions. This chapter is intended to ensure that outdoor furnaces are utilized in a manner that does not create a nuisance and is not detrimental to the health, safety, quality of life and general welfare of the residents of the Town.

2. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

WOOD — Dry, clean fuel only such as trunks and branches of trees and bushes, cord wood or untreated dimensional lumber, but does not include leaves, needles, vines or brush smaller than one inch in diameter.

OUTDOOR FURNACE — Any equipment, device or apparatus, or any part thereof, which is installed, affixed or situated outdoors for the primary purpose of combustion of fuel to produce heat or energy used as a component of a healing system providing heat for any interior space.

UNTREATED LUMBER — Dry wood which has been milled and dried but which has not been treated or combined with any petroleum product, chemical, preservative, glue, adhesive, stain, paint or other substance.

3. Permit required.

No person shall cause, allow or maintain the use of an outdoor furnace within the Town of Breitung without first having obtained a permit from the Town Board. Application for permit shall be made to the Town Board on the forms provided for existing outdoor furnaces only. The Town of Breitung will not issue permits for new outdoor furnaces. Use of new outdoor furnaces is prohibited within the Township of Breitung.

4. Existing outdoor furnaces.

Any outdoor furnace in existence on the effective date of this chapter shall be permitted to remain, provided that the owner applies for and receives a permit from the Town Board within one year of such effective date; provided, however, that upon the effective date of this chapter all the provisions hereof shall immediately apply to existing outdoor furnaces. All of the provisions of this chapter shall continue to apply to existing outdoor furnaces which receive permits. If the owner of an existing outdoor furnace does not receive a permit within one year of the effective date of this chapter, the outdoor furnace shall be removed. "Existing" or "in existence" means that the outdoor furnace is in place and in use on the site.

5. Specific requirements.

- A. Permitted fuel. Only firewood and untreated lumber are permitted to be burned in any outdoor furnace. Burning of any and all other materials in an outdoor furnace is prohibited.
- B. Months of operation. Outdoor furnaces shall be operated only between October 1 and May 31.
- C. The stack of the unit should, at a minimum, be taller than the roofline of all nearby structures. Stacks that are too short do not allow the emissions to adequately disperse.
- **6. Suspension of permit.** A permit issued pursuant to this chapter may be suspended as the Town Board may determine to be necessary to protect the public health, safety, quality of life and welfare of the residents of the Town of Breitung if any of the following conditions occurs:

- (1) Malodorous air contaminants from the outdoor furnace are detectable outside the property of the person on whose land the outdoor furnace is located;
- (2) The emissions from the outdoor furnace interfere with the reasonable enjoyment of life or property;
- (3) The emissions from the outdoor furnace cause damage to vegetation or property; or
- (4) The emissions from the outdoor furnace are or may be harmful to human or animal health.
- B. A suspended permit may be reinstated once the condition which resulted in suspension is remedied and reasonable assurances are given that such condition will not recur. Recurrence of a condition which has previously resulted in suspension of a permit shall be considered a violation of this chapter subject to the penalties provided as a misdemeanor as defined by Minnesota State Stature.

7. Waivers.

Where the Town Board finds that extraordinary and unnecessary hardships may result from strict compliance with this chapter, it may vary the regulations so that substantial justice may be done and the public interest secured, provided that such variations will not have the effect of nullifying the intent and purpose of this chapter or of jeopardizing the health, safety, quality of life or welfare of the public. In varying any regulations, the Board may impose such conditions and requirements as it deems reasonable and prudent. The Board may, at its discretion, hold a public hearing as part of its review. If the Board grants the waiver, a permit shall be issued for the outdoor furnace. If the Board denies the waiver, the outdoor furnace must either be brought into compliance with this chapter or removed. If the Board does not take any action with respect to the waiver within 60 days from its receipt of an application for waiver, the waiver shall be deemed denied.

8. Penalties for offenses.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor as defined by Minnesota State Statute. In addition, any permit issued pursuant to this chapter shall be revoked upon conviction of a second offense and the subject outdoor furnace shall not be eligible for another permit. Each day that a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense. The owners of premises upon which prohibited acts occur shall be jointly and severally liable for violations of this chapter. Any fine imposed hereunder shall constitute a lien upon the real property where the outdoor furnace is located until paid.

9. Effect on other regulations.

Nothing contained herein shall authorize or allow burning which is prohibited by codes, laws, rules or regulations promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, or any other federal, state, county, or local agency. Outdoor furnaces, and any electrical, plumbing or other apparatus or device used in connection with an outdoor furnace, shall be installed, operated and maintained in conformity with the manufacturer's specifications and any and all local, state and federal codes, laws, rules and regulations. In case of a conflict between any provision of this chapter and any applicable federal, state or local ordinances, codes, laws, rules or regulations, the more restrictive or stringent provision or requirement shall prevail.
