BREITUNG TOWNSHIP ANNUAL MEETING MARCH 10, 2020

Meeting called to Order: 8:35 PM

Nominate moderator: Motion by Steve Burgess, seconded by Chuck Tekautz to nominate moderator Tim Tomsich, motion approved unanimously.

<u>2019 Minutes reviewed:</u> Correction on 2019 Minutes Levy amount to \$616.000; motion by Matt Tuchel, seconded By Tony Sikora to accept 2019 Annual meeting minutes with correction, motion carried unanimously.

Township of Breitung 2019 Rehab Project: Moderator Tomsich reviewed the 2019 Rehab Project. Clerk/Treasure office 99% completed. Small list of items left on final list. I.E. Coat rack, front door. Hold retainage of \$14500 until final inspection. Parking lot will be finished this summer; more blacktop and stripping planned when weather permits. Resident Tony Sikora congratulated the Board regarding the project/building.

<u>Financial Report:</u> The Township is in good shape with \$350,000 in the black. Next three years will pay off the MPFA loans. Breitung Township self- audits and is good financially. Motion by Greg Dostert, seconded by Rolf Anderson to approve the financial reports.

Road and Bridge: Moderator Tomsich reviewed the Road and Bridge report presented by Maintenance Supervisor Swanson. Usual plowing, sanding in the winter months. Widening roads with the loader wing. Great Lakes Pipe cleaned sewer lines with a vacuum truck and jetter. Repaired main line water leak on Main St. (4) frozen lines this winter season. Cleared out the TWP complex for the rehab project. Lower docks McKinley Park in spring and raised docks before freeze up.

Motion to accept the Road and Bridge report by Chuck Tekautz, seconded by Dan Nylund, motion carried unanimously.

<u>Police Report:</u> Chief Nylund reviewed the 2019 Police report. Chief Nylund broke down calls per day. Saturdays the busiest day for PD. Full report available at Clerk's Office. The Breitung PD community involvement: Breitung 4th of July picnic. Attend / assist Halloween on Main Street in Tower for area youths. Stuff the Ambulance at McDonald's in Virginia. Shop with a Cop. Hand out ice cream certificates for wearing bicycle helmets. Social Media on Facebook and Twitter. Free Ice Cream Cones at Hoodoo Point campground. Full report available at the Township Clerk's Office. Motion to approve the PD report by Laurie Anderson, seconded by Jayne Sundeen, motion carried unanimously.

<u>Fire Department:</u> Chief Burgess reported 15 FD members. 51 emergency calls for 2019 compared to 49 in 2018. Members actively involved in the fire hall remodel and contributed over 200 main hours to move out and move back into new hall. Contributed 230 main hours for FD and community events. 202 main hours for emergency calls. Purchased, repainted equipment and put into service mini pumper/rescue apparatus. Completed boat house project to enable fire/rescue boat to respond from water versus off trailer that enable less response time to emergency calls on Lake Vermilion. Setup and put into service cold water rescue sled and rescue equipment for winter use. Set up and put into service fire equipment sled for use for no road access areas in winter months. Full report available at the Clerk's Office. Motion by Chuck Tekautz, seconded by Dale Swanson, motion carried unanimously.

McKinley Park: Good year at the campground. Revenue was up almost \$14,000. Expenses were up \$386. Season went smoothly with no problems. Our goal is to have safe, friendly, and fun campground for all ages. Reservations strong for 2020. Park manager thanked the Township Board, Clerk/Treasurer, maintenance, PD for their support and help. Motion by Rolf Anderson, seconded by Chuck Tekautz, motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Report: Tomsich thanked the residents for attending the annual meeting, and participation in the township government. Awarded two grants totaling \$250,000 for Town Hall and Surface building improvements, and parking lot improvement.

Architectural resources prepared options regarding improvements for the town hall, and community center, and Surface building. The option supported at the March annual meeting was bid, awarded. Construction is nearly completed with only a small list of punch items outstanding and final blacktop coat and striping to be completed in 2020. An Open House celebrating the town hall remodel was held 1-23-20, and the new community center was officially opened to the public. Many Thanks to Dale Swanson, maintenance supervisor, who announced his plans to retire Sept. 1, 2020 after many years of dedicated service to the township. His replacement, Tom Gorsma, was selected in December and started on the job March 1, 2020. Thank you to Polly McDonald, who also announced that she would not be seeking another term as clerk and the new clerk was elected today.

Annual taconite municipal aid payment of \$15,000 to the township will be paid in 2020 through legislation that the Governor signed into law. Bids were opened and awarded to complete the blacktopping for the new State Park road, with completion set for 2020. The construction cost is being funded with Minnesota State Park road account and engineering is funded through IRRRB grant. Thank you to employees, volunteers, and the clerk and treasurer. Your dedication, integrity, and work ethics result in an open and effective township government. Motion to accept Chairman report by Steve Burgess, seconded by Matt Tuchel, motion carried unanimously.

Tax Levy: For several years levy decreased, with help from the Super PILT. The Township was able to pay off the Fire truck; County took over assessor duties; and \$16,0000 from PILT.

PILT went from \$158,000 to \$160,000 and hope properties continue to increase in value. 2021 higher wages/benefits for PD and maintenance. Project was a big expense, ambulance is requesting subsidy increase. Tomsich stated keep the levy same for 2020 and 2021 @ \$616,000.00. Motion to accept Breitung Township Tax Levy by Matt Tuchel, seconded by Tony Sikora, motion carried unanimously.

Zamboni: Discussion at a previous Township meeting regarding purchasing a Zamboni for the Breitung TWP ice rink. Discussion revolves around the need for a Zamboni, storage, maintenance, costs. Chairman Tomsich asked the group at a previous Township meeting to put together usage, maintenance, storage, etc. If need to increase the tax levy, only the Board can make that decision. Mary Beth Reller stated why is this being discussed again, and is there a need for the equipment? The Township has hired Tom P. for maintenance and scheduling local residents to assist at Chimpy's skating parties, and maintenance, i.e. shoveling, etc. for years. The Zamboni group stated the ice would be in better condition with a Zamboni, safer ice, etc. The group also stated they would sell advertising to be placed on the Zamboni and that would raise revenue. Moderator Tomsich again asked for a proposal that was supposed to be presented with costs, etc. Storage is an issue if Zamboni stored at Township maintenance building and driving the rig back and forth and pick up rocks, etc. and is it hard on streets. The group stated they would setup a stand- alone company. Lease the Zamboni to the Township for \$1.00. Insurance should be minimal costs. The group stated they are in the process of receiving a LLC structure plan. Again Moderator Tomsich stated the Board requested a business plan with all the ideas, etc. in writing. The rink itself needs the new boards put up and some ground work complete. When flooding the rink, the water does not level out on the surface. The Township will work on the Boards / grounds this summer. Moderator Tomsich requested Nate Dostert to put options in writing for the Board to review. 2021 Annual Meeting Date: March 3, 2021

- The improvements to the post office, fire hall, town hall & community center and the Surface building were completed. An open house celebrating the town hall remodeled facilities was held on January 23, 2020 and the new community center was officially opened to the public.
- The pandemic directly affected the township operations and we have been following the CDC recommendations and complying with the changing Governor's orders to help reduce the spread of this deadly COVID-19 virus.
- The public works/maintenance department employees changed significantly this year with the retirements of Dale Swanson and Tom Poderzay. Congratulations and thank you for your contributions to our township. Thank you to employees, volunteers and the clerk and treasurer. Your continued dedication, integrity and work ethics result in an open and effective township government.


