Importance: High

The Culture and Tourism program will be accepting applications beginning March 1

Strong arts, culture, heritage and recreational activities are essential to the quality of life and economy of northeastern Minnesota. In support of these activities, Iron Range Resources & Rehabilitation's Culture and Tourism grant program will accept applications for its second funding cycle of the fiscal year **from March 1- 31.**

The Culture and Tourism program supports capital improvements, historic preservation, community arts and culture, tourism and recreational activities, and promotion to new audiences.

Grants are awarded on a competitive basis to cities, townships, tribal units of government and non-profit organizations with projects within the agency's service area.

- Applicants are required to provide a 1:1 match per project. Grant awards range from \$2,500 to \$30,000.
- ***Full applications should be submitted with all required documentation no later than March 31st in order to be considered for a grant.***
- Applicant may receive one Culture & Tourism grant per fiscal year for a maximum of three consecutive fiscal years.
- At the time of application, the applicant must not have any outstanding or open Culture & Tourism grants.
