- Recreation Supervisor Peitso commented on the improvements made to the baseball field facilities including painting, trim work, and roofing; noted that chain link dug outs were being considered for improved spectator viewing.
- Wastewater Board Supervisor Tuchel discussed updates on the rapid filtration bed noting that the boring samples looked good for the project, would be working with JPJ in the coming weeks to determine exact site position; further noted that the water plant was making good progress and was expecting the exterior building to be completed by December.
- Ambulance Commission Supervisor Tuchel stated the commission had met on the 8/26/24 and approved the contract. He had also attended the Ely City Council meeting on 8/27/24 where the potential region-wide ambulance service had been discussed; the council motioned and approved an ad-hoc committee on the proposed service. Noted that the new ambulance had been delivered and was in-service; the ambulance commission would be looking at ordering another ambulance in the next year.

Old Business:

2025 Infrastructure – IRRR

The application to IRRR is to be submitted the week of 9/22/24 to include the Thompson Farm Road, Center Street, and Echo Point projects; it was noted that Thompson Farm Road portion of the project was potentially fully funded as follows: \$544k from the State of MN, \$20k from the MN-DNR, a proposed \$69k from the Prospector's Trail Club. Additionally, the application will not include work incurred due to the 6/18/24 flood that may or may not be covered by FEMA.

2025 Culture & Tourism - IRRR

It was noted that the pre-application for the grant was to be submitted by 9/26 and must include two written or verbal quotes on desired project (dugouts). Supervisor Peitso noted these would likely not be received in time and the application should be postponed until the spring of 2025 when the next application cycle opens.

Current Infrastructure Projects

• 22-126

Partial Payment Estimate No. 1 for project 22-126/2023 Infrastructure Improvements was reviewed. John Jamnick recommended payment.

Concerning project 22-003/2022 Infrastructure, it was noted that either a final pay request or final punch list should be received soon as the project should be finished or very close to it.

• 21-923

Change Order No. 1 & 2 for project 21/923 Stuntz Bay Road Improvements; The change orders were due to site conditions and to obtain more removal & replacements of bituminous, curb, and gutter. Supervisor Tuchel noted there should be funding available through the State Park Road Account and these changes should be fully funded; he was optimistic for the road and better drainage. Motion by Supervisor Peitso to approve the change orders

Loop Trail

With plans drafted for the loop trail, the City of Tower had expressed concern regarding the path of the trail and overflow parking. Eric Fallstrom, engineer for St. Louis County Public Works, would prefer more buffer between the trail and the shoulder of the road, also concerned with wetlands. \$20k had been received from the Blandin Foundation and \$22k from the IRRRB; Chairman Tomsich discussed submitting an application to the DNR in March of 2025. Additionally, an environmental review was requested from JPJ to be completed prior to the DNR application, is possible.

<u> Thompson Farm Road – LRIP Update</u>

Chairman Tomsich noted the LRIP was in the county's hands for review.

Ordinance Number 90-03A – Water & Sewer

Chairman Tomsich noted that the status of the ordinance was currently on hold until the future status of the water commission is determined, it was noted that a significant change in the way the water and sewer department is managed may be necessary.

Flood/FEMA Process

Clerk Zak updated the board on current FEMA processes including a meeting that occurred on 09/06/2024. As of meeting time, Clerk Zak was tasked with totaling the damages, improvements, and status of individual damage sites, working closely with Public Works Supervisor Gorsma. Chairman Tomsich noted that disaster management is reimbursable by FEMA, up to 5% of the total cost of damages. Due to the nature of the work being outside the duties of the clerk, Tomsich recommended payment for total hours spent on the flood reimbursement project. Discussion was had on rates between the supervisors. Motion by Supervisor Tuchel to pay Clerk Zak \$21.00/hour for flood management work 2nd by Supervisor Peitso Motion Passed 3-0
